## OBJECTIVE 2

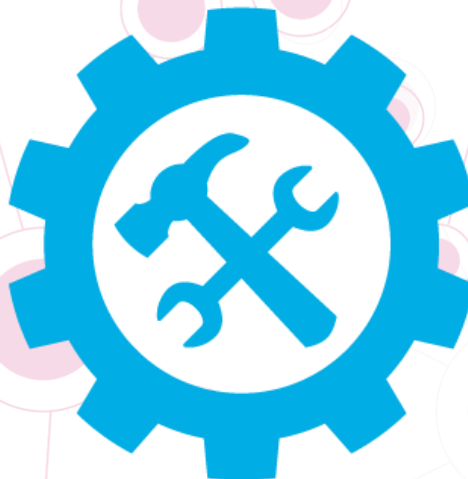
- > Healthy Start - St. Petersburg shared family planning and early pre-natal care materials

Coordinated Intake and Referral team is working on process revisions.

This team meets regularly to work through processes for connecting prenatal women and infant referrals to the most suitable community home-visiting program.

Moving forward, a centralized team understands all home visiting programs and can better guide participant selection (improvement). Revision will be ongoing based on funding, need and capacity.
